

SAVE OUR GREEN BELT



As members of our community, it is crucial to recognise the significance of preserving the Green Belt. It not only creates green corridors around London and adds to the aesthetic appeal of our surroundings, but it also plays a vital role in maintaining the ecological balance and biodiversity and helps mitigate the effects of climate change.

To save the Green Belt in and around Hadley Wood it is essential for each resident to actively participate by submitting comments during the Enfield draft Local Plan consultation and ideally by donating to the Green Belt fighting fund.

As explained in the separate Local Plan Update, the final round of consultation runs from 28th March to 20th May 2024 and provides a platform for all of us to voice our concerns regarding the future development and preservation of our local area. Many of you already commented in 2021, but those comments are no longer valid.

What Can You Do?

 Submit Comments: Every resident, along with friends and family, is asked to submit comments during the Enfield Draft Local Plan consultation. Your input can influence the decisions made regarding the protection of our Green Belt, as your comments will be passed on to the Independent Examiner. **How?** Check the Council's 'Enfield Local Plan' web page, our own website (www.hadleywoodnp.co.uk) or the leaflet we'll distribute to every household in April.

What? Our website summarises the key issues to include in your objection, or email hadleywoodnp@gmail.com for advice and guidance.

- 2. Donate to Support Legal Action: We urgently need donations to fund the legal advice required for the consultation process and the leading planning barrister, who we will ask to represent us at the Independent Examination if we can raise £65,000 (+ Gift Aid). These legal experts will help put forward the best possible case for not releasing our Green Belt. To donate, please visit www.hadleywood.org.uk and remember to tick the Gift Aid box to add 25% to your contribution, at no extra cost to you.
- **3. Spread Awareness:** Inform your friends, family, neighbours about the importance of participating. Encourage them to submit comments and, if possible, donate to the fighting fund. Details are provided on www.hadleywoodnp.co.uk.

Why Should I Get Involved?

Failure to support the Green Belt Campaign could lead to dire consequences for our community. The Duchy of Lancaster owned fields off Crescent West will be released from Green Belt protection, paving the way for development. The Duchy of Lancaster and Enfield Council have proposed building homes on this land, suggesting 160 new homes. However, based on expected dwelling density and the possibility of building up to 7 floors high on the lower part of the site along Monken Mead Brook, this number could well escalate to 500 homes.

Everyone in Hadley Wood would be affected.

At a minimum, adding this many properties will exacerbate traffic congestion, worsen air pollution, heighten the risk of flooding and increase the pressure on our local infrastructure, e.g. school places. The repercussions will significantly impact on our quality of life and the well-being of our community.

Please seize this final opportunity to protect our Green Belt and let's make our voices heard. In supporting us by submitting comments and donating to the Green Belt Campaign Fund, you



are ensuring that our community's environmental heritage is safeguarded for future generations to enjoy. Together, let's stand up for our Green Belt and make a positive impact on the future of Hadley Wood.

Station Cuttings: Treegate Celebration

It was heartwarming to see everyone who turned up for the Treegate event on 11th March. Members of HWRUG and the HWA supported The Tree Council on this celebratory occasion to mark the success of the original national hedgerow trial planted five years ago at the station and to plant the new national trial "Miyawaki hedge" which is supposed to grow like Jack's beanstalk. The Tree Council will be monitoring its progress closely and we can all watch it too, as it's in a strip just over the fence from the cycle path. They and Network Rail showed us a promotional film

featuring the new approach to trackside vegetation management that was kick-started by our Treegate Campaign of 2018 and which has just won them jointly an Environmental and Sustainability award.

Special thanks to Vice-Chair Gill Henley who did so much to ensure that the event ran so successfully and to members Bill Morris and Lisbeth Wirth who masterminded public address/music and refreshments respectively.

We also took the opportunity to lobby our MP and the VIP guests from the railway industry about the unavailability of the **station toilet**. As a result, Lord Peter Hendy, Chairman of Network Rail, contacted the CEO of GTR later the very same day to flag up our continuing concern about the appalling waste of this much-needed facility and asked us to keep him posted. We shall!

Network Rail's Chair, Lord Hendy of Richmond Hill, said "It's wonderful to see how the landscape at Hadley Wood has developed in the last five years.

"It's a great reflection of the work and care shown by The Tree Council, the many community volunteers and our own colleagues at Network Rail.

Jon Stokes, Director of Trees, Science & Research at The Tree Council, and Chair of Hedgelink, said:



"Animals and plants like edges, because there's light and security - it's why you find the busiest areas of biodiversity in woodland to be along the margins.

"A hedge is nothing but edge, so it's perfect.

Following criticism of the clearance at Hadley Wood, the government ordered John Varley to undertake an independent review of Network Rail's lineside vegetation management.

The Varley Review carried a number of recommendations, which The Tree Council is helping deliver. These include managing the lineside as an asset, improving communication with nearby communities, and leading cultural change within Network Rail around valuing nature and the environment...

Rail Minister, Huw Merriman said: "It's great to see the positive impact hedgerows are having in Hadley Wood, forming a corridor for wildlife to thrive along one of the country's busiest railway lines while reducing noise pollution for local residents.

"I hope to see more schemes like this up and down the country as Network Rail continues to help make the rail network greener."





Francesca Caine, Chair Hadley Wood Rail User Group (HWRUG), said: "HWRUG was founded to campaign for an accessible entrance to platform four, which was opened in May 2017.

"Since then, we have continued to work with partners to enhance our station and maintain our train services.

"This is our second collaboration with The Tree Council and Network Rail, and we are delighted to be part of the development and planting of this magnificent new hedgerow, which not only lifts everyone's spirits but also benefits wildlife and will become a model for the future management of the railways."

Gifting can reduce IHT and help support your family now rather than making them wait for an inheritance

You can gift up to £3000 each tax year, your annual exemption as well as make any number of small gifts up to £250 per person. Apart from this all other gifts are usually referred to as potentially exempt transfers and take seven years to be disregarded for inheritance tax.

4. Make the most of trusts in inheritance tax planning

Gifts to certain trusts are referred to as chargeable lifetime transfers and can also take seven years to be disregarded. This is an area that needs Financial Advice as there are several different types of trust and there are different ways of setting them up. In some cases, you may be able to access the funds, but in others you can't. Trusts are quite a specialised and complex area of financial planning, so do speak to me before you make any choices.

5. Use pensions to help estate planning

Defined contribution pension schemes will fall outside of your estate so if you're looking for an efficient way to pass on wealth, pensions could play a big role if you have several different Pension pots, you could choose to pass one or more to your children or grandchildren. If you die before you are 75, your pension pot can usually be paid as a lump sum or income to any beneficiary tax-free. If you die after 75, your beneficiaries will need to pay tax at their marginal rate on withdrawals,

Forest School Approach

At Alphablocks in the Hadley Wood Association, we will be implementing the Forest School approach that holds high expectations about children's skills and development. From this approach, we bring the following elements into our curriculum

The interaction with the natural world: Woodland environments provide children with space for exploration and a real sense of discovery. The children will learn about nature and physical or biological phenomena and develop a sense of belonging and responsibility towards the natural world. They will develop strong physical skills and learn how to work together as a team.

The learner-centered approach: By participating in engaging, motivating, and stage-appropriate tasks and activities in a woodland environment, children develop strong emotional and social skills. Our mission at Alphablocks is to develop confident and resilient children who enjoy the process of learning.

Daily interactions with the natural world: While our Forest School sessions are held in the local woodland area, the Forest School approach immensely influences our day-to-day practice. Children learn outside every day, whatever the weather, use tools, take and manage risks and engage with natural materials in and out of the classroom.

We will be having the following open afternoons, where we hope to meet some of the prospective families interested in joining us in September 2024 and finding out more about our curriculum and ethos.

Enfield Council - Local Plan update

A lot has happened in the past few weeks.....

- The Councillors were due to vote to approve their draft Local Plan going to final 'Regulation 19' public consultation on 6th March. However, the Hadley Wood Neighbourhood Planning Forum, via legal counsel, wrote to the Council to request that the meeting be deferred as they had not released crucial papers, had not accounted for the new National Planning Policy Framework that gives Council the choice of not releasing Green Belt land to meet housing targets, and had not adequately reflected our Neighbourhood Plan.
- The Council then released a large number of documents and delayed their vote to 19th March. However, as expected, the majority Labour Councillors voted in favour of the draft Local Plan 2019-2041, which proposes to build over 9,400 new homes on land that is currently Green Belt near us (mainly in Crews Hill and opposite the Pick Your Own farm, but also 160+ homes on the fields off Crescent West).
- The Local Plan will now go to its final round of consultation, from 28th March to 20th May 2024.
- We have been very busy reviewing the Plan which, with 296 documents totalling thousands of pages, has been a mammoth task.
- We have started to draft our response to the Plan, which will be fine-tuned by the planning consultants and legal counsel and submitted by the Hadley Wood Neighbourhood Planning Forum.
- On 11th March we arranged a briefing session at the HWA Centre thank you to everyone who
 made the effort to attend.
- Please read our 'Save Our Green Belt' article because we need everyone to submit comments and donate to our fighting fund, if able. If we can raise £65,000 + Gift Aid we can be represented by a leading planning barrister from Landmark Chambers at the Independent Examiner's hearings, which we think may be crucial for success.

Please submit your objections during the consultation period, and donate to our fighting fund. We need the whole community to get involved.
